



Operational BY-LAW N° 21
CONCERNING THE REGISTRATION OF BICYCLES

CONSIDERING that it is in the public interest to regulate the use of bicycles;

CONSIDERING Notice of Motion has been duly given;

THEREFORE it is proposed by Councillor J.C. Nicholson, seconded by Councillor H.B. Norris and resolved that a by-law bearing No. 21 be and is adopted and that it be enacted and decreed by said by-law as follows:

1. Every owner of a bicycle or anyone using a bicycle within the limits of the Town and being a resident thereof must register such bicycle at the office of the Director of Police.
2. The license plate, issued at the time of registration, must be attached securely to the bicycle and no person shall use the bicycle in the Town unless the bicycle has a valid license plate attached to it.
3. In the event of loss of the license plate, the owner or user of any bicycle is required to re-register the bicycle at the office of the Director of Police before it may be used again in the Town.
4. The charge for registering or re-registering each bicycle shall be determined by Council according to law.
5. Anyone contravening a provision of this by-law, or tolerating or permitting such a contravention, commits an infraction and is liable, besides the costs, to the following fine:
1. for a first infraction:
a minimum of TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (25 \$) and a maximum of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (1 000 \$) if the offender is a physical person or a maximum of TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (2 000 \$) if the offender is a moral person;
2. for a repeat infraction:
a minimum of FIFTY DOLLARS (50 \$) and a maximum of TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (2 000 \$) if the offender is a physical person or a maximum of FOUR THOUSAND DOLLARS (4 000 \$) if the offender is a moral person.
6. By-law No. 47 of the Municipality of the Village of Como East, by-law No. 82 of the Municipality of the Village of Hudson and By-law No. 100 of the Municipality of the Village of Hudson Heights are hereby repealed together with any other by-laws and regulations and articles or sections of by-laws and regulations which are not in conformity with the present by-law.
