

EXTRACT of Minutes of the regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Hudson held at the Community Centre on October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012, during which the following by-law was adopted:

# BY-LAW N<sup>O</sup> 621

### CONCERNING THE TOWN PLANNING ADVISORY COMMITTEE

**WHEREAS** the Town of Hudson's Town Planning Advisory Committee (TPAC) was created by By-Law No. 238 on April 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1990;

WHEREAS over the past 22 years the structure of the regulation for the TPAC has been the same;

**WHEREAS** the TPAC presently is legislated by By-Law No. 606 concerning the Town Planning Advisory Committee was adopted on December 5<sup>th</sup>, 2011;

WHEREAS it is advisable to structure the legislation as per the recommendations of the Ministry of municipal affairs:

WHEREAS certain citizens have shown an interest to be a member of the TPAC;

WHEREAS Council deems advisable to replace, annually, members of the Committee;

WHEREAS this orientation requires an amendment to By-Law no 606;

**WHEREAS** to facilitate the application of the regulation for the Town Planning Advisory Committee it is advisable to replace existing By-Law No 606;

WHEREAS notice of motion was duly given at the Council meeting held on September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2012;

**WHEREAS** the requirements of Article 356 of the Cities and Towns Act have been met and that Council members declare having read By-Law N° 621 and relinquish its reading;

**THEREFORE** it is <u>moved</u> by Councillor Robert Spencer, <u>seconded</u> by Councillor Jacques Nadeau and unanimously resolved that By-Law No 621 be, hereby, adopted and decreed as follows

## **ASSIGNMENT**

1. The committee is assigned to study and submit its recommendations to the Municipal Council on all questions concerning land use planning, zoning, subdivision and building, minor derogations & architectural controls in accordance with the *Act Respecting Land Use Planning and Development* (Q.R.S. c. A-19.1) (article 146 (2) LUPD¹)

# **MEMBERS**

- 2. The committee is composed of 7 persons, appointed by council.

  Two members must be from Council; the remaining 5 are residents of the Town of Hudson. (article 146 (1) LUPD¹)
- 3. The Council appoints to the committee, by resolution, officers of the Town. The officers do not have a voting right. (article 147 LUPD¹)
- 4. The Council appoints to the committee, by resolution, resource-persons. They include but are not limited to the consultant hired to oversee the works and assist the committee. The resource-persons do not have a voting right. (article 147 LUPD<sup>2</sup>)
- 5. The chairperson shall be appointed by the Municipal Council.
- 6. The secretary of the Urban Planning Department, or the replacement, will act as secretary to record the minutes of all meetings, other than those, which are public. Where the meetings are public, the assistant Town Clerk shall act as secretary and shall record the minutes of the meeting.

#### **MANDATE OF MEMBERS**

- 7. The duration of the mandate is fixed at one (1) year for all the members.
- 8. The mandate of each member is renewable by Council resolution. (article 146 (4) LUPD²)
- 9. The Council will replace at least one member annually. The member replaced shall be the senior member.
- 10. In the case of resignation or absence at three consecutive meetings, the Council shall appoint, by resolution, another person to complete the duration of the mandate of the seat which has become vacant

# **ETHICS AND GOOD CONDUCT**

- 11. All members must conform to the Town of Hudson's By-Law No 605 Code of ethics and good conduction for elected municipal officers of the Town of Hudson.
- 12. All members must file a disclosure statement in writing with the Town Clerk within 30 days after receiving a gift, hospitality or other benefit that is not of a purely private nature and whose value exceeds the value specified in the code, which may not be greater than \$200. The disclosure statement must contain an accurate description of the gift, hospitality or benefit received and specify the name of the donor and the date on which and the circumstances under which it was received. (article 6 MEGC<sup>3</sup>)

#### **CONFLICT OF INTEREST**

- 13. All members must conform to Division II Disclosure of pecuniary interests of Council members of the Chapter XII Related rights and obligations of the Act respecting elections and referendums in municipalities (R.S.Q., c. E-2.2) adapted as required. (article 363 and 307 RERM<sup>4</sup>)
- 14. Within 30 days prior to his appointment by Council, the member must file with the Council a written statement of this pecuniary interest in accordance with article 357 of the *Act respecting elections and referendums in municipalities (R.S.Q., c. E-2.2)* adapted as required. The form of this written statement is Annex 1 of the present By-Law.

#### **EXPENDITURES**

- 15. All expenditures must be approved by Council. (article 148 LUPD<sup>5</sup>)
- 16. The committee shall present each year, in the month of November, its forecast of expenses.

# INTERNAL MANAGEMENT

- 17. The committee establishes the rules of internal management which are necessary for the accomplishment of its functions in accordance with the present By-Law and the *Act Respecting Land Use Planning and Development (Q.R.S. c. A-19.1). (article 146 (3) LUPD<sup>5</sup>)*
- 18. The rules of internal management must be submitted to Council for ratification by resolution.

#### **MEETINGS**

- 19. In addition to the meetings forecasted and convened by the committee, the municipal council may also convene the members of the committee by giving a preliminary written notice issued by the Town Clerk at least 48 hours in advance.
- 20. A quorum of the Committee shall be four (4) members.

## **REPORTS**

- 21. The studies, recommendations and notices of the committee are submitted to the Council in the form of a written report.
  - The minutes of the meetings of the committee may be used and act, as it is seen fit and in the case where they are judged sufficient, as written reports.
