A FEW REMINDERS

PARKING PERMITS FOR JACK LAYTON PARK NOW AVAILABLE

A parking permit is required to park at Jack Layton Park and on Wharf Road, at all hours of the day, and on Beach Road and at the Community Centre from 3 pm to midnight. Permits are free for Hudson residents. Go to www.hudson.quebec/en, and click on the "Parking pass" link on the home page to submit your online application.

USE OF PESTICIDES

If you are considering spraying pesticides on your land, note that By-law 739 on the control of pesticides prohibits their use throughout the territory, except for certain exceptions such as cases of infestation, security, public health, or prevention reasons. Anyone wishing to use pesticides on their land must apply for a permit and ensure that the conditions outlines in By-law 739 are met, otherwise, they are liable to penalties.

PERMITS

Thinking of renovating your home? Would you like to install a pool this summer? Before starting any work, it is important to inquire with the Urban Planning Department to determine if a permit is required.

LAWN WATERING

Lawn watering is restricted based on address and type of watering system. If you have:

- An automatic watering system, you are permitted to water your lawn only from 2 a.m. and 4 a.m. on the day corresponding to your address (see table below)
- A mechanical watering system, you are permitted to water your lawn only from 8 p.m. and 10 p.m., on the day corresponding to your address (see table below)

UPCOMING PROJECTS

PAVING OF MAIN ROAD

The roadworks begun in October 2022 will be completed this spring - summer. Work is planned to begin in May but may start sooner, or be delayed, depending on weather conditions, and will take place over 6-8 weeks.

UNIDIRECTIONAL FLUSHING OF THE AOUEDUCT SYSTEM

Flushing of the aqueduct system is done annually. and will take place Monday to Friday between 7:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. beginning in May.

This operation consists of evacuating the particles and fragments attached to the inside walls of the aqueduct network pipes. The dirty water is evacuated through the fire hydrants.

Flushing the system can cause a change in water pressure and/or may produce a reddish (rusty) colour. This situation is harmless, and the water is potable, but it is recommended to avoid washing clothes or dishes between 7:30 am and 4:00 pm. If your water appears discoloured, run the cold water until it becomes clear.

UPDATING THE URBAN PLANNING PROGRAM - PROTECTION OF NATURAL AREAS

We are now in the 3rd phase of this project; drafting by-laws which are in concordance with by-law 525.3-2022: by-law to further amend the planning program – protection of natural areas.

A public consultation session will be scheduled once these draft by-laws are tabled.

PROPERTY INSPECTION VISITS

Inspection visits for the purposes of the property assessment roll are now underway. The property assessment firm, Leroux, Beaudry, Picard and Associates, Inc., Chartered Valuators, will be conducting the visits. The firm's representative will carry a photo ID an an identification letter signed by an authorized Town representative.

TREE TRIMMING 2023

Hydro Québec will be trimming trees near medium-voltage lines in Hudson this year. See the map of planned work below. Trees near power lines are cleared on a regular basis. The schedule may change at any time without prior notice, according to weather- and other conditions.



ENVIRONMENT

GREEN WASTE AND LEAVES...TOGETHER!

NEW THIS YEAR!

Leaves are now accepted in the green waste collections. In addition, the frequency of green waste collections has been increased in the spring and fall to better serve you.

A reminder to:

Place your paper bags and reusable containers at the curb with your brown bin the day before collection. The bags must be closed without tape and kept out of the weather until the day of collection.

BRANCH COLLECTION

REGISTRATION REOUIRED!

Registration period: May 1st to May 12th. The spring collection of branches will begin on Tuesday, May 23rd, 2023. Collection will take place over approximately 10 days. All branches must be at the curb before 7:00 a.m. May 23rd.

The contractor will only collect the maximum amount of 3 metres long by 3 metres wide by 1.5 metres high; any additional branches will be left on your property.

Help us speed up the process! Place the widest portion of each branch towards the street.

BULK ITEMS COLLECTION

The Town of Hudson provides 8 bulk item collections from April to November. Collections are held on the 3rd Friday of each month.

Registration is required and must be done by the Tuesday prior to the collection. To register, go to www.hudson.quebec/en and click on the "Service Request" quick link. Include a list of the items you want picked up.

Bulk items collected during this collection are sent directly to a landfill site. Bringing your bulk items to the Ecocentre or offering them to a local reuse organization is a better gesture for the environment. Some organizations will even pick up your bulk items.

WHAT IS ACCEPTED IN THE COLLECTION:

Wood furniture, mattresses, couches, water heaters, washers, dryers, stoves, dishwashers and barbecues without propane tanks.

CARDBOARD COLLECTION

A special cardboard collection will take place on July 4th, 2023.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE:

Disassemble and stack your cardboard boxes by inserting them into a single box or by securing them with rope or tape. The size of the stacked boxes cannot exceed 1 square meter.

STYROFOAM IS NOW RECYCLABLE!

EVERY GESTURE COUNTS

Since the implementation of organic waste collection in September 2018, **over 1,100 metric tons** of organic waste have been diverted from landfills and transformed into compost.

This year, for the 3rd year in a row, we will be offering this compost free of charge to Hudson residents.

MAINTENANCE AND EMPTYING OF SEPTIC TANKS

Regular emptying of your septic system is essential to ensure it functions correctly and to avoid releasing contaminants into the environment. Conversely, poor septic system maintenance, including not emptying it often enough, can shorten its useful life.

EMPTYING REQUIREMENTS AND FREQUENCY

If you use your septic system year-round, you must have it emptied at least once every two years.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY

You must send the Town a copy of the invoice or a certificate from the contractor that includes the name and address of the owner and the date when they emptied the tank.

FINES

Both the Town of Hudson By-law 564 and the provincial by-law Q-2, r. 22 - Règlement sur l'évacuation et le traitement des eaux usées des résidences isolées provide for the issuance of fines for non-compliance.


